Once the initial decision is made, I don't really have a part in it. And I want to. In fact, I feel like I need to.

I realize the point is to give and that God knows our heart. There are no right answers - only obedience to Him where He has us right now. Are automatic payments a sign of trust that payments are going to happen regardless? Or is it a matter of out of sight out of mind, and whatever is left belongs to me?

In this season, I'm choosing to honor God by making an intentional monthly act. I need the reminder. It's all His, and I want to acknowledge that continually.
